

AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2794
OFFERED BY Mr. Goldman of New York

Add at the end the following:

Sec 30. Report on the Reunification of Families Separated by the Trump Administration

Not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report on the status of reunification of children separated from their families under the Trump Administration, including through the Zero-Tolerance Policy as well as the pilot program known as the El Paso Initiative. The report shall include the following—

- (1) the total number of children known to have been separated from their families, including their parents, legal guardians, or siblings
- (2) information indicating whether it is possible that more children were separated but are still unknown to the federal government
- (3) information about how the federal government is working to identify U.S.-born children who may not have been entered into any federal databases upon being separated from their families
- (4) the nationality of each child that was separated
- (5) the age of each child at the time of being separated from their families
- (6) the total duration of time each child was separated from their parents or legal guardians
- (7) the total number of parents or legal guardians that were removed from the United States after being separated from their children
- (8) the total number of children that have yet to be reunited with their families and whether the identity of the family members who they were separated from is known
- (9) the total number of reports or complaints by children or family members separated under the Zero Tolerance Policy or the El Paso Initiative alleging abuse or violations of law by Department of Homeland Security personnel and the steps taken by the Department to investigate these incidents

- (10) the total number of whistleblower complaints made to the Department of Homeland Security regarding family separation, including through implementation of the Zero-Tolerance Policy as well as the El Paso Initiative.
- (11) information about what actions are being taken to reunite children who remain separated from their parents
- (12) recommended actions Congress can take to ensure that all children, parents, or legal guardians impacted by the Zero Tolerance Policy or El Paso Initiative are accounted for, as well as to support the reunification of families

(b) NO IDENTIFYING INFORMATION. The report submitted under subsection (a) shall not include the name or date of birth of any child or adult.

(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—The term “appropriate congressional committees” means—

(A) Committee on Homeland Security and the Committee on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives; and

(B) the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, and the Committee on the Judiciary of the Senate.
