Strong support for the Holocaust education is necessary to help shed light, provide clarity, preserve the memory of the Holocaust, and teach the lessons learned to the younger generations.

We are grateful for your support in FY 2023, and we urge the Committee to provide the highest possible funding for the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum for Holocaust education in FY 2024.
